We were expecting a tough game on Sunday, and it got even tougher after two minutes.

hat was so frustrating because we talked about it beforehand, that we had to come out of the box really strongly, really convincingly.

But we didn't and we allowed them some time around the box

Collectively if you allow Sterling to score a header in the middle of the box – you can't beat City like that.

After that we tried to react in the best possible way. I think we matched them up, we had some really good moments, we created some great opportunities but we lacked the quality around the box to find the right pass and the right man to score the goal.

Against that opponent, everything has to be perfect.

I was pleased with the personality of the team after

we conceded though. To show that courage, and to match them the way we've done, is really difficult. I've seen many other games in the last few months of theirs. It's something to be positive about but obviously we are disappointed because we got nothing from the game.

That was all down to the first ten minutes. During that time we didn't do something that we had talked about in our preparation, of what to do at times when we would suffer in the game – and they used it against us a couple of times and we were exposed. After that, we corrected it and looked much better and much more comfortable.

It's true though that there was some fatigue, and you could see that in both teams at the end. The boys are playing a lot of minutes right now, they are working







extremely hard, so we cannot demand too much more of them.

It was a difficult game to have in the middle of these Benfica matches, but we have been fully focused back on Europe since the final whistle on Sunday.

We have just come out of a tough game — it was full gas from the beginning — so of course we will need to make some changes again tonight.

Obviously we need a fresh team and we need fresh legs as well because decision-making and everything becomes better when you are fresh.

With the schedule that we have right now, it is really demanding. We have no time to recover and little time to prepare. Against City for example, we could not prepare for the game on the field because we didn't have enough time. But we have to get used to it and we had an extra day for this game. Then straight away we go to Leicester. It's the same for most teams at the moment.

But the players want to be the best that they can and prepare in the best possible way for every single match and that's what they are doing.


The Europa League is really important for us. It's one of the ways we can get back into Europe, and every defeat in the league puts us in a much more difficult position there.

We have to take it game by game and we need a run of good results. I think we have a big run of performances, but we've lost three games now in different ways and it's not what we want.

But we are very excited about this competition. We've been on a really strong run this season in the Europa League and we have a good opportunity to make another step forward tonight.

It's strange to be playing a home game in Athens, and very unusual, but I believe we have to try to maintain the integrity of the competition as much as we can.

The only way to do that at the moment is to play at different venues, but at least it's played over two legs with the away goals rule always present, so not too



much has changed.

We have good memories of playing here. We beat Olympiacos 1-0 in this stadium last season, even if we went out in the second leg.

That's a reminder for us though – the way we went out of the competition last year is our warning.

The tie was in our hands, but then we conceded in the last minute of extra-time. We still had a massive chance with Auba to go through, but the big lesson there is that you have to play every single minute of the competition with a high focus.

Every detail matters and every situation has to be handled, and it's about being able to manage the game in the way it's required because it's over two legs. The goal difference is very important and that has to be in the back of your mind, and you have to be able to control your emotions and as well be able to change the game when you need to, to take it to your territory when the tie is in your hands.

I hope that defeat to Olympiacos can be another motivation for us. It was a really tough experience for all of us with the way it happened because we deserved to go through. But also that created more hunger for this season to go and do more. We haven't gone through yet, so let's put more energy, more passion and more commitment into this competition to make sure we get it done.

We know you will be getting right behind us tonight, whether you are watching back in London or wherever you are, and we appreciate that support always.



Playing Benfica in the Europa League brings back memories for me of when I played against them for Borussia Dortmund in 2017.

t was in the Champions League knock out stages, and I had a bad game in the first leg. I didn't just miss a penalty, I missed all of my chances that first game! The whole way through the game, I was missing a lot of chances. I remember I had three clear opportunities to score and then the penalty as well. Ederson was actually the Benfica goalkeeper at that time and I remember that I came back into the dressing room afterwards and I was really upset. Honestly, I think I cried a little bit about my performance and when I went back to Dortmund on the plane. Just before we flew I called my family to talk about the game.

I said to them that I'm going to do everything to try to qualify my team in the second leg and I will do it for you, I promise. And then, in the end, I scored three goals at home in the second leg to send us through. I think in Dortmund, when you play at home in the second leg, it's really different and you can change everything in that environment because the fans are unbelievable and they give you this incredible power.

This is what happened that night, it was a really great day to score those three goals.

I hope something similar can happen tonight. I missed a couple of chances in the first leg last week as well. I should have scored and that would have put us in a stronger position for this game. But we have another 90 minutes to play tonight to get the job done.

The difference to that game for Dortmund of course is that we are not at home tonight, and we won't have our fans with us.


To be honest it's really, really strange to see what's happening with this round. We played against Benfica in their home game last week in Rome, which was unusual too, for them and for us. Now are playing 'at home' in Athens in Greece, but at least we know this stadium. We played here last season against Olympiacos, and we won that night.

The same score again tonight will be enough for us go through.

So as I say, it's very strange for us, but these are the

things you face, you have to deal with it and once we are on the pitch it's down to us like it is in any other game.

Anyway, we have got used to playing without crowds over the last year. But even when it's empty, I much prefer playing at the Emirates than in away games. It's always good to play there because you have your routines, you can prepare and you know everything about the pitch and where you are. It's really different to not be there for this as a home game – then there is all the travel too.

As I said though, you have to deal with it, and that's part of wanting to do well and wanting to win trophies. We had to deal with it last season too and we did really well to win the FA Cup. Our target is to do the same in the Europa League this time.

We all want the competition to continue, so this is what we have to do.

One thing we need to remember is the away goals rule,

because we are still using that for these games. But for me personally, it's okay because I don't think it matters. We are all used to the away goals rule, we all know it, and we have to deal with it. We don't need to focus too much on it, we just need to try and win the game.

It would have been better to go into this game after a good result at the weekend, but Manchester City were just too strong for us on Sunday.

The really frustrating thing for us was that I thought we matched them up for most of the game, had a few chances ourselves, and could have got something for it. But after you concede in the first two minutes, obviously everything becomes much more difficult — especially against a team like City.

We showed our personality after that goal though, we kept playing and believing we could get something.

We need to show that same attitude tonight for the whole match against Benfica. If we can do that, and impose our game on them, I'm sure we can get the win. We'll be trying everything because it's another huge match for us.







WHEN IS AN AWAY PROGRAMME A HOME PROGRAMME?!

ur records suggest that today's match is the fourth time in Arsenal's history that we have produced a 'home' matchday programme for a match played outside of the UK.

On May 14, 1959 the Gunners travelled to Turin to play the mighty Juventus, reciprocating the Italians trip to Highbury earlier that season on November 26, 1958 — when Arsenal triumphed 3-1. The programme was predominantly in Italian but produced in a very familiar Arsenal style for a match in which the tables were turned with Juve claiming a 3-1 win this time.

In May 1966, Arsenal travelled to Turkey to play two games against Besiktas, the first a 2-o defeat in Istanbul on May 21, the second four days later in Ankara, which ended o-o. A single programme was produced for both matches in a classic Arsenal design.

On the Gunners' pre-season tour to Australia in 2017, the club created a souvenir programme for the two fixtures against Sydney FC (won 2-0) and Western Sydney Wanderers (won 3-1), on July 13 and July 15 respectively. Both matches were played at Stadium Australia in Sydney. This programme was created in-house in the UK by the programme team but printed in Sydney.

In addition, relatively recently, the club produced six programmes for 'home' games played at Wembley in our Champions League campaigns for seasons 1998/99 and 1999/00.

Finally, the programme produced by the Arsenal programme team for the visit of Farnborough for an FA Cup fourth round tie on February 13, 2003 was technically an away programme, due to Farnborough opting to move their home draw to Highbury.

The issue featured manager's notes and player interviews with representatives of both clubs.

AWAY GOALS RULE IN PLACE

If today's game ends in a o-o draw, Arsenal will progress to the next knockout round on the away goals rule. Any scoring draw of 2-2 or higher will see Benfica advance. If the match ends 1-1, two 15 minute periods of extra-time will ensue. Away goals will count double in extra-time. If it remains 1-1 after extra-time, penalties will determine the winner.

DRAW FOR THE NEXT ROUND

The winners of this Round of 32 tie will go into the Round of 16 draw, which takes place tomorrow in Nyon, Switzerland at midday UK time.

The two-legged Round of 16 games will take place on March 11 and March 18.

For this draw, there is no seeding or country protection.



HISTORIC HEADACHE FOR ROB!

Rob Holding became Arsenal's first ever concussion substitute when he was replaced by David Luiz on 82 minutes of the game against Manchester City on Sunday. After an accidental knee to the head from City's Joao Cancelo, Rob was subbed with a 'green form' meaning David wasn't part of the Gunners' three substitute allocation.

The concussion substitution meant that Pep Guardiola's team were allowed an extra sub, which they didn't utilise.

The new ruling, which is being trialled by the Premier League until the end of the season, also allows for a second concussion substitution if required, with the opposition then accruing a fifth substitution option.

Mikel Arteta confirmed that Rob would miss 'a few days training' following the concussion but at the time of writing no decision had been made with regards to selection for the game today.






FIRST HALF

We returned to European action after the winter hiatus for the first leg of the Round of 32 match against Benfica, and though this was counted as the away leg, the match was played in neutral territory due to travel restrictions. We started the game well in control, dictating the tempo of the game, and we should have taken the lead after 20 minutes. Hector Bellerin sprinted away on the right, slid the ball across goal for Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang unmarked at the far post, but on this occasion our captain's aim was lacking, and his shot went the wrong side of the upright. We were nearly punished for our missed chances late in the half when Grimaldo pounced on a loose Granit Xhaka pass, but Dani Ceballos got back well to block.

SECOND HALF

Benfica took the lead from a penalty award for an Emile Smith Rowe handball. Pizzi duly tucked home from 12 yards. We had scored in each of our previous 22 Europa League games, and we kept the run going. Cedric got in behind the defence to latch on to a Martin Odegaard pass, and centred for Saka to convert from close range. A valuable 'away goal' in this most unusual of European ties. We were back on the front foot and Aubameyang shot just wide shortly afterwards and Hector Bellerin had a shot blocked on the edge of the area but we were unable to find the winner, and need to complete the job in Athens.



hen Arsenal came calling, it was an opportunity that I just couldn't turn down. Barcelona was all I'd ever known, but I knew straight away that this was the club for me.

BOOTS

I loved growing up in Barcelona. As a kid, maybe five years old. I remember playing with my brother and dad in the park, and we'd spend hours practicing passing, dribbling and skills. Anything really, as long as the ball was at my feet. We had a park just outside our apartment in Barcelona and it was really nice to grow up in an environment like that. My family taught me everything.

Obviously, I was lucky enough to watch some of the greatest Barcelona teams of all time too. It was a real golden era of the club.

When I was really young, I remember going to Camp Nou for the very first time and Ronaldinho was on the pitch. I was just blown away because he was like nothing I'd ever seen before. When you're a kid, it almost felt like he was an alien or something from out of this world, and then a little kid called Lionel Messi came along! It was an amazing handover between two of the greatest we've ever seen.

Once | realised that playing football is something | enjoy,

my family signed me up to a team in the local area and I loved it right from the start. We played together for a while, but I remember that in my final season we played some amazing football and had the chance to play Barcelona, and this is where it all started. I played really well on the day and that's when Barcelona offered to sign me!

I joined them aged nine and I've got nothing but good things to say about my time there. It was an amazing

experience and they taught me so much. At Barcelona, football is all about having the ball, appreciating the ball and education, so that taught me a lot about the game from

I played with a lot of very talented players during my time at La Masia too. I played with Robert Navarro, Iliax Moriba and Pablo Moreno, plus loads of other really good players. We were a very good generation and it really boosts your development when you're surrounded by talent like that.

I didn't realise as a kid, because I was just taking everything in my stride, but now that I'm older, I realise how big it is that I was able to learn at La Masia as a kid of Barcelona. I've realised how much they taught me about football and how certain values and beliefs are ingrained into me. They taught me about tactics and the art of the game, and I think as you get older, you realise more and more just how much they taught you.

The first time I heard from Arsenal, it was during my last season in Barcelona. I was 15 at the time and Barcelona wanted to keep me, but the first time I heard from Arsenal, I couldn't believe it. I was with my parents, brother and agent at the time, and I just couldn't stop laughing! I was so happy! I wasn't sure if it was going to happen at the time, but I had such a good feeling about the move. When a club like Arsenal calls your name, it's different. It feels amazing. From there, it was stuck in my mind. I had a vision I wanted to achieve, and in the end, I obviously made the move to north London.

For me, it was the history and class of the club. Not only their history of playing beautiful football and winning trophies, but their history in the academy too. With the

projection that this club provides to young players, it was a massive incentive for me to sign.

I think the fact that players like Hector and Cesc followed this path gave me confidence in my decision too. They left Barcelona at a similar age to me, and Hector is someone I really admire. Not only as a player, but as a person too. He's someone I've always appreciated. Hector has been amazing to me ever since I joined the club, but it's honestly not just me in the academy. He tries to help everyone and he's such a good influence in training. I don't need to say anything about Hector on the pitch because we all know how important he is. It's easy to forget that he's still only 25 too because he burst onto the scene at such a young age.

I've been here at Arsenal for three years now and I've loved every minute of it. I remember when I first joined, I was shocked at the physicality of the game compared to Spanish football, but I adapted really well to Arsenal's style of play. I couldn't believe how much everyone was running during my first game! It was such a new experience to me they were so passionate and physical! 

MY The Arsenal Foundation

The work of The Arsenal Foundation and the partners and initiatives it supports have touched the lives of a great number of people in a variety of ways

The Arsenal Foundation's emergency Covid fund has helped the Afghanistan and Central Asian Association (ACAA) run a helpline for refugees and asylum seekers during the pandemic. Morsale Ghafooryar, 22 and from London, tells us how the service helped vulnerable people and communities...

have been at ACAA for almost nine months now after graduating with a law degree from the London School of Economics. I'm the daughter of two Afghan refugees myself, and my work feels especially rewarding because I feel a personal connection with each client. I believe passionately in supporting refugees to help give them strong foundations upon which to build a life. Everyone should have equal opportunity to be happy and prosperous, as well as to provide a stable upbringing for their children so they can thrive and follow their passions.

I started as the outreach officer to expand the charity's services to vulnerable communities nationwide during the lockdown so that people could receive vital help remotely. I also managed our Covid-19 Telephone Helpline Service, providing direct help and advice or referring callers to other departments within the charity or to local organisations that could offer specialist support, for example with mental health issues. One of our key aims was to identify those at risk of developing depression or loneliness during lockdown.

The helpline ran for 24 hours a day, initially for three months from June to August 2020, yet it remains open now. I established a two-way referral network with local organisations in each city, which enabled me to both receive referrals and refer callers to support organisations. That meant, for example, I could arrange for food bank and






clothing deliveries, which was a big help for those struggling to get help because there was a language barrier.

The target audience was vulnerable communities including refugees, asylum seekers and BAME minorities who were disproportionately affected by the lockdown. The Arsenal Foundation helped to buy a new office mobile phone, including its bills, to ensure all calls would be answered during the day, as well contributing to my salary, with which I also bought a phone to keep operational 24/7.

Help with housing was a frequent request. This may be a compound effect of the struggle for housing refugees face ordinarily alongside the government's effort to temporarily house the homeless during the quarantine period. We also received calls about welfare and social engagement, and mental health issues were common — a reflection of the increased pressure on families caused by the lockdown, but also a promising increase in confidence for refugees and asylum seekers to seek help over tensions in their homes.

We are very grateful for Arsenal's support. I believe affluent organisations are important in supporting grassroots organisations to stabilise the lives of vulnerable communities. Ultimately, the benefits of helping refugees, ethnic minorities and vulnerable people to achieve their goals are universal, because with the right support everyone is capable of becoming someone great.



How far forward do you look at the fixture list?

I always try to focus on the game ahead, so if we're playing against Manchester City next month, for example, I don't keep thinking about Manchester City. I always think game after game, because if I start thinking about Manchester City, tomorrow I might play against another team that might also do us harm, so I always try to think about one game at the time.

At which stage of the week do you start thinking about your next game?

Before, when I was younger, I used to get a little nervous the night before, but it doesn't happen quite as much these days. Now I get more nervous just before the game, when we're warming-up. You get butterflies in your stomach and worry about the match, especially if it's a big one, but it's a good feeling, because you want to be there.

What are your plans for the end of your career?

It's a difficult question. I have no idea about what I might want to do when I stop playing football yet.

Do you know what country or city you will you live in once you stop playing football?

This is also something I haven't thought about, but one place I really like is France. I have many friends there and the area where I lived is really good, so it's a place I would consider.

What other countries would you like to visit when we are able to travel again?

I don't have any specific countries I'd like to go back to. The only place I'd like to visit again, to enjoy the city, is Paris, because I like it a lot, but there isn't a specific country I've travelled to that I think "I'd like to go back to that country, because I like it there". There isn't one.

Another place I would like to visit though is Miami.

THROWBACK FOUR

Arsenal historian Jon Spurling looks at a quartet of interesting games between Arsenal and Benfica

The legendary



Champions Challenge Match August 4, 1971

After suffering a 2-0 reverse in Lisbon five days earlier (Batista and Portuguese superstar Eusebio scored the Eagles' goals), Double winners Arsenal were keen for revenge in London on a warm summer's evening. The Gunners, who'd opted out of competing in the

annual Charity Shield clash at Wembley due to having arranged a series of prestigious international friendlies, set about the Portuguese League Champions from the off. Defender John Roberts nodded in a cross by left back Sammy Nelson, striker John Radford headed in a George Armstrong cross in the 34th minute, and then Armstrong made it 3-0 just before half-time. After an out of sorts Eusebio was substituted at half-time, Benfica clicked into gear, and Jorge netted a diving header in the 53rd minute, and Diamantino fired a cracking shot past Geoff Barnett in the 73rd minute. The (now) nervous 44,244 crowd saw Benfica mount attack after attack, but Arsenal regained their two goal lead when George Graham fired home after a Frank McLintock free kick. To show that this was rather more than an international friendly, Benfica players swarmed around referee Norman Burtenshaw (who'd refereed the FA Cup final back in May), claiming that Graham was offside. Due to the ferocity of the Benfica team's complaints, the Norfolk official reported the whole team to the Football Association. Peter Storey (from the penalty spot) and George Graham (with his second) added late goals to round of a memorable Highbury evening.










European Cup Second round first leg October 23, 1991

Having safely navigated their way past Austria Vienna in the opening round of the European Cup, George Graham professed himself to be "over the moon" when Arsenal drew Benfica as they participated in

Europe's leading club competition after a 20 year gap. "They're one of Europe's historic glamour teams, and the European Cup is all about nights like this," he enthused. Arsenal had goalkeeper David Seaman to thank after leaving the gigantic Estadio Luz with a draw. In front of a vociferous crowd, George Graham's team initially acquitted themselves well, taking the lead when Kevin Campbell finished superbly after an exquisite through pass from David Rocastle. But Benfica fought back, and the lively Brazilian forward Isaias netted the home side's equaliser. Gunners manager George Graham was less than impressed, criticising his team for "backing off too much after Benfica scored, and not closing down their strikers quickly enough." Graham warned his charges that in the Highbury return: "We'll have the advantage of the away goal, but will need to guard against carelessness and loss of concentration."












European Cup Second round second November 6, 1991

In the second leg, Arsenal playing in their now iconic bruised banana away shirt - set about Benfica with gusto. Watched by a Highbury crowd of 35,815, the early signs were that the side's

forward thrust would act as a wrecking ball to the visitor's fragile looking defence. Central defender Colin Pates swivelled and thumped home the opener - and Graham's side should really have plundered more goals. Kevin Campbell and Tony Adams both hit the Benfica woodwork, and Alan Smith skied his shot into the North Bank - a chance he'd usually have buried. But the night unravelled after Isaias - Arsenal's torturer in Lisbon - lashed home Benfica's equaliser. George Graham later castigated his side's "helter-skelter football. The key to playing in Europe is patience and guile, and not to panic. Once Isaias equalised, we collapsed." On two occasions, Benfica's Swedish ball winner Stefan Schwarz fed Isaias and Russian Vasili Kulkov killer balls, and Arsenal exited the competition on a night of frustration. In the aftermath of the loss, the Gunners' league form suffered, and Graham criticised midfielder Paul Davis for defying his instructions and venturing too far forward. In the long term, Davis would return to spearhead Arsenal's successful Cup Winners' Cup campaign in 1993/94, but only after a lengthy spell out in the cold.











Emirates Cup August 2, 2014

season tournament. A crowd of almost 60,000 at the Emirates Stadium saw Calum Chambers make his firstteam bow, Nacho Monreal fill in at centre back, and new signing Alexis Sanchez appear in the 71st minute, but by the time the Chilean star entered the fray, Arsenal were in complete control of the match. French striker Yaya Sanogo, without a goal in the previous season, netted his first from close range after being set up by a fine turn and cross by Aaron Ramsey. In the 40th minute Joel Campbell placed the ball into the bottom corner from 15 yards. The Costa Rican then teed up Sanogo to make it 3-0 in the 44th minute. With Benfica capitulating, Sanogo completed his hat-trick on the stroke of half-time, stabbing home a cross from Kieran Gibbs from five yards out. Sanogo netted his fourth goal just after half-time, tapping in after Benfica goalkeeper Artur failed to hold Ramsey' shot. The biggest cheer of the afternoon may have been reserved for the appearance of a not yet match fit Sanchez late on, but the afternoon belonged to Sanogo.




The man who led Benfica to those two Europa League finals, Jorge Jesus, returned to the club as head coach last summer, after five years away, but there was a major disappointment for the Lisbon giants soon after his return when they lost their opening European game of the season, a UEFA Champions League third qualifying round tie in Greece against PAOK Salonika, the 2-1 defeat ending the club's unbroken ten-year run in the Champions League group stage and sending them instead into the Europa League equivalent, where they had only competed once before in the inaugural 2009/10 campaign

It is a curiosity that although Benfica have only appeared in two Europa League group stages, they have played more matches in the competition's knockout rounds than any other club, this being their 42nd. As in 2009/10, when they won home (5-0) and away (2-0) against Everton, the Eagles soared through their group this season, but although they emerged unbeaten, three wins and three draws were only good enough to qualify them as runners-up behind Rangers, with whom they shared the points in both Lisbon (3-3) and Glasgow (2-2) before finishing above both Standard Liege and Lech Poznan.

Last week's 1-1 draw against Arsenal in Rome not only preserved Benfica's unbeaten run in this season's Europa League but also stretched their undefeated home record in the competition — despite the temporary move from the Estadio da Luz to the Stadio Olimpico — to a record 26 matches. Now, like the Gunners, they must do battle again on foreign soil, making a return trip to Greece, as they endeavour to make it six round of 32 qualifications out of seven, the only failure having come last season when they were knocked out by Shakhtar Donetsk.

Runners-up to double-winning FC Porto in both Portuguese league and cup last season, Benfica seem unlikely to regain the Primeira Liga crown they last won in 2018/19, having fallen a long way behind local rivals Sporting, who beat them 1-0 with a stoppage-time winner in a pressure-packed derby at the start of February, but they are more than halfway towards securing a return to the final of the Portuguese Cup, having won the first leg of their last-four duel with Estoril 3-1 away. The second leg takes place next Thursday – the night after the conclusion of the other semi-final, in which Braga and Porto meet at the Estadio do Dragao level-pegging at 1-1 after the first leg.



MUTUAL Admiration

STEFAN SCHWARZ played just a single season for Arsenal, in 1994/95, but his excellent contribution left many supporters thinking 'what might have been' when he headed to Fiorentina in the summer of 1995, after what was a tumultuous season for Arsenal Football Club. The Swedish central midfielder played 49 games, scoring four goals, two of which came in the Gunners' run to the European Cup Winners Cup final, when he played the full 90 minutes against Real Zaragoza.

He joined Arsenal after starring for Sweden in the 1994 World Cup, where his team finished third, prior to that Stefan had spent three seasons with Benfica whom he had joined from Malmo in his homeland. He won the Portuguese Cup in 1993 followed by the league title in his final season at the Estadio da Luz and became recognised as one of the leading central midfielders in Europe. His strength in the tackle and distribution skills, persuaded Arsenal to pay £1.8m for his services.

xperienced Portugal international Cedric grew up in the youth academy at Benfica's city rivals Sporting Lisbon, spending 17 years there before his move to Southampton in 2015.

He played in many editions of the 'Derby de Lisboa' while there, and was able to put his local knowledge to good use in the first leg of this tie, albeit being played at a neutral venue away from Benfica's Stadium of Light home.

But Cedric was suitably inspired by facing his old adversaries, and sent in the cross for our equalising — and potentially valuable — away goal scored by Bukayo Saka.

That was on Cedric's eighth consecutive start for the side, the last seven of which came at left back, and the versatile defender exclusively told the matchday programme all about his recent run in the side last week.

You've been filling in at left back lately which you did previously with Southampton and Inter Milan. How have you found it here?

Of course it's very different to playing on the right for me, but I can always adapt to new positions and I will always adapt for what the coach needs. I will be ready for anything that the coach and the club needs me to do. If he needs to play left back then I can guarantee that I will give my best, 100 per cent.

What did the coach say to you about playing at left back?

Well, obviously because I am right footed it's something different in terms of the spaces you try to occupy and maybe the profundity that you can give to the team from one side to the other can change a little bit in some situations. But you have other stuff as well that can actually sometimes be beneficial in terms of playing with a right-footed player on the left. The coach gives me the freedom but of course, I still need to follow the game plan. But I feel that he trusts me and I feel his confidence. That makes me want to give that back by giving him good performances and to try my best for the team.

Tonight we face Benfica again, and as somebody who grew up with Sporting Lisbon, you must have a lot of memories of playing against them?

Yes, I played so many times against Benfica! It was always a difficult game because they're derbies for us. It was always huge. I don't want to just mention one game because they were all really special moments to me in my memory, 100 per cent.

How heated and passionate do the Lisbon derbies get?

They are so very, very passionate. Every game is important but when it comes to the Lisbon derbies it is something more. Everyone is trying to be in the stadium, everyone is talking about the game all week in the week before and in the week after too. It's normal for these games to make you feel that way. As a player, you always feel a little bit more pressure when it is Benfica against Sporting because everyone in the squad wants to be playing in these games. It's what football is all about really, so for me, it was always very nice to be able to play in these games against Benfica and I think every footballer wants to be involved in those occasions.



Do you still keep a close eye on Portuguese football?

Yes, I watch it a lot. I also watch a lot of Premier League games but I always watch a lot of Portuguese football. They're normally on at different times so I can watch them both and I follow it very closely. I think the standard of the league is quite good.

What can you tell us about Benfica?

Benfica is a very strong team. It's normal for them to be one of the strongest teams in Portugal so it's no surprise, but we need to make sure we are ready for it. They have some great players and they normally have individuals who are very technically talented and have a lot of skills. They're quite organised at the moment and in Portugal it's always been a big club. Of course, we need to respect them in this competition but at the same time we cannot fear them. I have 100 per cent trust in my teammates at Arsenal that we will do our absolute best in these games to get the victory.

How strong is Portuguese football in general at the moment?

It's always been a league that's growing as a championship. I would definitely use the word growing.







I think also if you look around Europe then you can see that there is a lot of talent coming out of the Portuguese leagues and Portugal in general. There are actually quite a lot of Portuguese players playing in the Premier League for example and they are having some success. So I think it's a signal that the league in Portugal is also becoming more competitive and will keep getting more competitive. Of course, I still think that the Premier League is the best league in the world and it's where everyone wants to be, but at the same time the Portuguese league is a strong league and is becoming more important in terms of how it is seen in comparison to other European leagues.

The first leg was in Italy, and this one is in Greece, it's a very different experience isn't it?

Yes, it's quite strange! I've never lived a situation like this. Actually, maybe when I played in my national team I had something similar, because I remember a game that we played one time in Switzerland. It was Portugal against Egypt, I think, so that was quite different. But at that moment in time, the stadium was open and that helped. Right now, playing in Italy and Greece, it will be a strange feeling but in another way because the fans are not here, the game doesn't have this influence from the outside in terms of the crowd and who the crowd is supporting. We know it will be a tough game and we must be ready for it.

Do you think maybe in the future that teams will play one game, in a country that neither team is from and maybe that's the future of European football?

I didn't see this question coming! I don't know, I really don't know, but what I can say is that I honestly believe it is still really important that you get to play in your own stadium and then you play away. It still has quite a big influence on the game in these European cup competitions.

Is there anything that you've learned during the pandemic or something that you can take forward when we do have fans back in?

Of course. In the beginning it was quite strange. We were so used to the fans and I think they are such an important part of the game. But it's important that even if they are not there, we know that they are following us and they are with us, even if it just has to be through the TV. But it's really important for us to keep our concentration levels up because sometimes when you don't have fans you may actually lose a little bit of concentration in the game and I think that this has been improved because we are now playing every week like this, with nobody in the stadiums.

Is concentration the biggest difference to having crowds in then?

I love crowds. Honestly, I love the crowds. Personally, I would love to be playing with fans and I have always loved that feeling of a crowd. It makes the game so much more emotional and I am an emotional person. I like it a lot when the game has this atmosphere and this environment surrounding it and the pressure that it brings. At the end of the day, this pressure is the thing that can really take you to another level and it can make you give even more than you thought you could give because the fans just help you and you want to give them the victory. I think right now, all of the teams are getting used to playing without fans and in the beginning it was of course different. Nowadays, we are used to it and I think we are getting better with the levels of concentration.

Do you think not having the fans in is actually helping you in terms of coaching? Not just in terms of the manager but as a defence, with your goalkeeper and all of your teammates because there is no competing noise level?

In terms of communication, yes it is definitely easier. You can hear everything but don't forget, the opponent also hears you and your coach. So of course when our coach wants to pass a message, it passes much quicker to all of us but that means every player on the pitch, even the opposition. It makes it much easier for us to talk to each other during the game. I remember back to during the Euros, I couldn't even talk to the player next to me. He was only five metres or so away but you just couldn't really talk to your teammate because of the noise of the fans, which made it quite hard in terms of communication. But like I said, this is part of football and I love it. I would much prefer to lose part of our communication to have the fans back in!

FIRST HALF

An early goal from Raheem Sterling put us on the back foot immediatley against the leage leaders. After just two minutes Sterling drifted between our centre backs to direct his header past Bernd Leno after Riyad Mahrez delivered a cross from the right. Sterling almost added a second moments later but Rob Holding nicked the ball off his toe. Then Mahrez beat Pablo Mari but his shot was deflected wide. We survived further damage and were far more competitive after the opening ten minutes. We looked dangerous whenever Bukayo Saka ran at City in central-left positions, and his link-up with Kieran Tierney was especially productive. Tierney supplied regular crosses but City dealt with them all. One cut-back from the Scotsman did allow Saka to get a shot in, but the ball hit Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang.

SECOND HALF

Saka was a threat after the break too, one slaloming run ending with a blocked shot. At the other end Leno was at full stretch to keep out Ilkay Gundogan's precise effort. City were still seeing more of the ball but we reached the final 20 minutes still very much in the game and almost levelled in bizarre circumstances. Joao Cancelo's attempted clearance turned into a wild backpass and Ederson, not wanting to handle the ball, volleyed straight to Elneny. His first-time effort had power but flew wide.



SILKY CEBALLOS

n the absence of Thomas Partey, Dani Ceballos has stepped up with two dominant midfield performances at a crucial stage of the season.

Marcelo Bielsa attributed our 4-2 victory over Leeds United last week to the Spaniard's influence, and just four days later he delivered an all-action display in the Europa League against Benfica as well.


In both of those fixtures, we lined up in a 4-2-3-1 formation with Ceballos alongside Granit Xhaka - but unlike his midfield partner, our No 8 has greater freedom to take risks during the build-up phase and push forward into the final third.

A composed and technically gifted midfielder, Ceballos toyed with Benfica all night long, dancing around their midfield and playing a number of incisive passes behind their three-man defence.

In fact, our greatest chance of the evening was almost single-handedly created by Ceballos, who threaded a stunning pass behind Benfica's defence to release Bukavo Saka into the penalty area. The only thing missing was the finishing touch from our captain at the far post.

The numbers certainly back up the quality of Ceballos' performance too. Our No 8 registered the third highest number of touches (98) at Stadio Olimpico, in addition to attempting 80 passes at a success rate of 92.5 per cent.

Ceballos also registered eight ball recoveries, three interceptions, two tackles, and won five of his 10 duels. To gain a greater understanding of Ceballos' influence on the game, take a look at his heap map and touch map, which perfectly illustrate his desire to contribute in all phases of play.


